Adding Pictures for Clarity:

To improve usability, I incorporated more images throughout the instructions and added annotations to clarify what they were depicting. Visual references make it easier for users to follow along, especially for those unfamiliar with meal prepping. By including pictures, I ensured that users could quickly understand what each step should look like, reducing the chances of confusion or mistakes.

Reworking Rice Cooker Instructions:

Originally, my rice cooker instructions were tailored to the specific model I own. However, since not all users will have the same type, I revised the wording to make these steps more universally applicable. Now, the instructions provide general guidance that can be adapted to different rice cooker models, making the overall document more user-friendly.
